Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The British Sundial Society exists to provide an educational benefit to the public. It is affiliated to the Royal Astronomical Society. The Society's Objects are specifically to advance the education of the public in the science and art of sundials and dialling (gnomonics). Any surpluses in income are used in furtherance of the Society's objects

The Trustees confirm that they have had regard to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance where relevant.

The Society is a membership charity, open without restriction to any person whether UK-resident or not. Its trustees are unpaid. The cost of membership is maintained at the lowest viable rate and this serves to fund the main activities of the society which are:-

- Publishing periodic Bulletins, containing papers, letters and reviews or other material of interest concerning gnomonics.
- Maintaining and updating the two National Registers of known fixed sundials and of church mass dials which exist in the British Isles.
- Making available for sale to members, academic and heritage organisations approximately every five years the compete National Register of sundials.
- Giving free advice to any member of the public on the preservation and restoration of existing dials and the construction of new ones.
- Suggesting the names of lecturers able to speak about sundials and related matters to any public forum.
- Operating an open award scheme to promote and recognise the best in design and construction of new sundials.
- Organising conferences, tours and visits related to the understanding and appreciation of sundials and dialling.
- Publishing books, booklets, monographs and leaflets on dialling and related matters.
- Maintaining a reference library of relevant books and documents devoted to dialling accessible to all members, plus members of the hosting library.
- Operating an interesting and free-to-all, educational web site devoted to dialling matters and including some copies of earlier Bulletin articles.
- Giving free advice to any member of the public wishing to understand and know more about sundials.
- Offering grants to UK residents to help toward the cost of restoration of publicly viewable dials.

The Society holds two meetings annually, which are open to members and non-members alike and which are advertised both nationally and internationally:-

- 1) A one-day meeting, habitually held in rural Berkshire, involves a voluntary entry fee of around £10, which goes to cover hall hire and refreshments.
- 2) A three day/two night residential weekend conference. As the membership is widely dispersed over the country, it is held at changing locations, so as to equalise easier and cheaper access. Its charges are set to meet the cost at an expected level of attendance. Day rate charges (that is attendance without accommodation) are offered for those who might be local to the event or for those wishing to make use of alternative or cheaper local accommodation.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Numerous enquiries from the public answered on nature and history of individual sundials. Extended advice given on restoration practicalities of seven cases, most of which the owners proceeded with.

Specialist advice given to Leicester Parks Department for the Proudman sundial in the public domain, on its maintenance and preparation of the interpretation panel.

Annual Conference attended by approximately ninety delegates, including representatives of four other countries. The Newbury meeting attracted nearly fifty participants.

Four editions of the Bulletin published, with increased colour printing and contributions from and of interest to a worldwide constituency.

Stocks of non-current Bulletins beyond archive requirements were distributed by Trustees to interested parties in their communities.

The programme of producing monographs of otherwise unavailable material progressed towards further publications.

Deposits continued to be made to the Borthwick Institute (York) of collected data (images and analysis) of mass dials found nationally, increasing the research material available to academic institutions.'

Members contributed to the public understanding of astronomical science with talks given to local civic groups – generally without fee

Extensive technical advice given to a non-member on constructing an unusual large-scale outdoor reflecting sundial

Reviewed the user strategy for the reference library, improving its public accessibility.

Awards given to designers of online sundial trails, aimed at encouraging the public to explore science and history in many localities.

BSS website updated and remaining ranked in the top 2% of world ratings. It remains on the rolling archive of representative sites operated by the British Library.

Refreshing of web pages highlighting stolen sundials

Development of freely accessible pages, enabling location of sundials in any area, together with relevant history

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The organisation's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The organisation's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act), as amended by s.28 of the Charities Act 2006 and in accordance with the Charities Act 2011) and that an independent examination is needed.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2011

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Incoming Resources

Recognition of Incoming Resources

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when:

- · the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- · the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources; and
- · the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability

Incoming Resources with related expenditure

Where incoming resources have related expenditure (as with fundraising or contract income) the incoming resource and related expenditure are reported gross in the SOFA.

Grants and Donations

Grants and Donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

Tax reclaims on Donations and Gifts

Incoming resources from tax reclaims are included in the SOFA during the same period as the gift to which they relate

Contractual Income and Performance Related Grants

This is only included in the SOFA once the related goods or services has been delivered

Gifts in Kind

Gifts in kind are accounted for at a reasonable estimate of their value to the charity or the amount actually realised. Gifts in kind for sale or distribution are included in the accounts as gifts only when sold or distributed by the charity. Gifts in kind for use by the charity are included in the SOFA as incoming resources when receivable.

Donated Services and Facilities

These are only included in incoming resources (with an equivalent amount in resources expended) where the benefit to the charity is reasonably quantifiable, measurable and material. The value placed on these resources is the estimated value to the charity of the service or facility received.

Volunteer Help

The value of any voluntary help received is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report

Investment Income

This is included in the accounts when receivable.

Investment gains and losses

This included any gain or loss on the sale of investments and any gain or loss resulting from revaluing investments to market value at the end of the year.

Expenditure and liabilities

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources.

Governance Costs

Include costs of the preparation and examination of statutory accounts, the costs of the trustees meetings and cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

Grants with performance conditions

Where the charity gives a grant with conditions for its payment being a specific level of service or output to be provided, such grants are only recognised in the SOFA once the recipient of the grant has provided the specified service or output.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2011

Grants payable without performance conditions

These are only recognised in the accounts when a commitment has been made and there are no conditions to be met relating to a grant which remain in control of the charity.

Support Costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of the resources, e.g. allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

Changes in Accounting policies and previous accounts

There has been no change to the accounting policies (variation rules and methods of accounting) since last year, and no changes to the previous accounts

There are no annual commitments under non-cancelling operating leases and no capital commitments.

Assets

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity

The BSS library is stated at valuation, based on the 2003 value calculated by Roger Turner Books, and modified to take account of the effects of inflation and new purchases.

Investments

Investments quoted on a recognised stock exchange are valued at market value at the year end. Other investment assets are included at trustees' best estimate of market value.

Basis of preparation:

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis of accounting in accordance with the Charities Act 2011 and in accordance with applicable accounting standards. In preparing the financial statements the charity follows best practice as laid down in the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005.

9. TRUSTEES AND OTHER RELATED PARTIES

Other than the reimbursements of expenses incurred whilst acting on behalf of the charity, No other payments were made to trustees or any persons connected with them during this financial period. No material transaction took place between the organisation and a trustee or any person connected with them.

10. RISK ASSESSMENT

The Trustees actively review the major risks which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining the free reserves stated, combined with the annual review of the controls over key financial systems carried out on an annual basis will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also examined other operational and business risks which they face and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

11. RESERVES POLICY

The trustees have considered the level of reserves they wish to retain, appropriate to the charity's needs. This is based on the charity's size and the level of financial commitments held. The trustees aim to ensure the charity will be able to continue to fulfil its charitable objectives even if there is a temporary shortfall in income or unexpected expenditure. The trustees will endeavour not to set aside funds unnecessarily.

12. PUBLIC BENEFIT

The charity acknowledges its requirement to demonstrate clearly that it must have charitable purposes or 'aims' that are for the public benefit. Details of how the charity has achieved this are provided in the Trustees report. The Trustees confirm that they have paid due regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit before deciding what activities the charity should undertake

13. BANK ACCOUNT

The charity has a bank account open in the USA as of 31st December 2010 this account held £1,712.92 (converted as at the December 2010 exchange rate) this has been included as a prior year adjustment.
