BSS Conference April 5-7 2013 in Edinburgh

The annual BSS Conference will have 15 talks, covering a wide variety of subjects. Six of the speakers will talk on dials that they have themselves made, showing that invention, design and craftsmanship of the highest order are alive and well. Several others will discuss their studies of, and conservation of, important historical sundials in stone and metals. Bringing the subject into the twenty-first century will be a survey of Apps for smartphones of use to sundialists.

The modern world's understanding of the astronomical and engineering achievements of the Ancients has, in recent years, been stood on its head by the discovery and understanding of the stunning Antikythera Mechanism. Our keynote speaker will be Dr Tony Freeth, who initiated and led many of the key studies of the mechanism. His film The 2,000 Year Old Computer has been shown on BBC4 many times. He will speak on aspects of the device, the extraordinary techniques used to dissect it, published and current understanding of its mechanism and dials, and what is still unknown or controversial. He invites attendees to indicate their interests so as to direct his talk to the audience.

As well as a very full programme of talks, there will be opportunities to see dials and other exhibits brought by 15 exhibitors. On Saturday afternoon we stretch our legs to see the unique dials in George Heriot's School, a guided tour of the National Museum of Scotland, and other important dials along The Royal Mile.

The social highpoint of the weekend will be a Gala Dinner of Saturday in the opulent eighteenth century Playfair Library.



Restored Polish sundial unveiled in Greenwich

On 10th October the British Sundial Society organised an unveiling ceremony in Greenwich for a restored sundial, designed by Tadeusz Przypkowski in the 1960s.



On 10th October the British Sundial Society organised an unveiling ceremony in Greenwich for a restored sundial, designed by Tadeusz Przypkowski in the 1960s. Przypkowski's sundial was installed on the southern wall of the Royal Observatory. The event was hosted by Kevin Fewster, the director of the National Maritime Museum, and the sundial was unveiled by Sir Mark Lennox-Boyd, patron of the British Sundial Society.

According to Tadeusz Przypkowski's original project, the sundial was intended to be made of marble, not wood, and it soon fell victim to the elements. The unveiling of the new, reconstructed sundial is particularly significant, as it reinstates the Polish timepiece in the most important geographic location of all-the prime meridian which is used to determine mean solar time and the world's time zones.

Thanks to the combined efforts of the Polish Embassy in London and the Greenwich Maritime Museum, the event was attended by a representative of the Przypkowski Museum in Jędrzejowo, Rafał Zaczkowski and a delegation of Polish sundial enthusiasts, Elżbieta Niedbałka and Dariusz Oczki.

In 1969 the 'Meridies Media' noon mark mean time sundial, designed by Dr Tadeusz Przypkowski (and with amendments by Chris Daniel) was installed on the south wall of the Meridian Building in what was then the Old Royal Observatory at Greenwich. In the years since it deteriorated and had to be taken down. In 2009 a movement was started to reinstate a replica. Chris Daniel, who had been curator of the sundial collection of the National Maritime Museum at the time of the original installation was asked to design the replacement. This he has undertaken at his own expense. The dial is to be formally opened by BSS Patron Sir Mark Lennox Boyd on Wednesday 10.10.12 at 12:30pm. It will represent a fitting second Jubillee dial in Greenwich Park.


